Analysis of Types of Psychological Disorders

- Psychogenic Depression:** A type of depression that arises from psychological factors, such as emotional distress or trauma, rather than a purely biological cause.
- Antisocial Personality Disorder:** A personality disorder characterized by a disregard for the rights of others, lack of empathy, and often engaging in manipulative or harmful behaviors.

Thoughts and gains

Through this process, we learned to understand issues from different perspectives, including both victims and offenders, and discovered that childhood experiences and social environments can influence criminal behavior.
